Submitted papers must be thematically oriented, stimulating society development and incorporate recent developments. The papers should be e-mailed to matjaz.gams@ijs.si with corresponding author's postal address, e-mail address, and phone number, not later than August 3rd, 2009. All submissions will be peer-reviewed by members of Program Committee and the acceptance notification will be sent to authors by September 1st. All accepted papers will be published in the conference proceedings that will be available at the conference.
